Facelifts

Water St. You MUST have a representative attend—this is YOUR meeting, where decisions about the upcoming season are made by YOU! There will also be information about safety requirements.

As in the past, we ask that each group contribute 6% of your GROSS proceeds to the Chamber of Commerce. This money helps us offset the expenses we incur, including renting the park from the city, bathroom cleaning, crossing guards required by the state, electricity and equipment use, etc. Please be courteous and remit this payment within TWO WEEKS of your food booth date.

Hello and WELCOME to the 2025 Princeton Flea Market!

This year our season runs from **April 19 — October 11**. Opening time remains 6am.

We will be accepting “daily” sellers again this year; the cost is \$35 per week. When you arrive, leave your vehicle and walk into the park to find me at the front of the FOOD STAND by the picnic tables.

I will assign spaces for daily vendors beginning around 6:30am. All spaces are roughly 20 ft X 10 ft.

We encourage you to become or remain a seasonal vendor. A Full Season Pass is only \$500, and a Half Season pass is \$275. Seasonal vendors are guaranteed spots at our busy flea market. As always, dealers who held a reserved space last year will be given first option to rent the same space again this year. These spaces will be held open until MARCH 24—No Exceptions! After March 24, new applicants will be filling open seasonal spaces.

Rules for Vendors:

A signed contract is required to obtain a seasonal space.

You may buy, sell or trade anything EXCEPT the following:

- Sandwiches (including brats, hot dogs, hamburgers, grilled cheese, etc) - all selling rights are reserved by the Chamber
- Soft drinks/SODA/other beverages to be consumed on-grounds - all selling rights are reserved by the Chamber
- Alcoholic beverages
- Animals
- Firearms & ammunition
- Fireworks
- Merchandise that violates trademark, tradename, or copyright laws
- Any other commodities prohibited by law

NO “political” booths are allowed which campaign for a political party or candidate for elected public office.

NO refunds are given for either daily or season vendors, regardless of weather.

NO dogs are allowed in the Flea Market park.

NO nails in trees.

FOOD SELLERS: Sale of prepared food items usually requires a health permit. If you have one, please include a photocopy with your application. For info, call Green Lake Co. Health Dept. at 920-294-4070.

RECYCLE whatever you can—it’s the law in Wisconsin!

To reserve your space this year, fill out the enclosed reservation form and MAIL it, with your check AND a self-addressed stamped envelope to reach us BEFORE MARCH 24. If we don’t receive your reservation by MARCH 24, your space will not be held for you. If we don’t get a SASE, we won’t mail your pass. PLEASE MAIL your reservation. If you have any questions, please call (920) 787-4815 between 9am and 7pm.

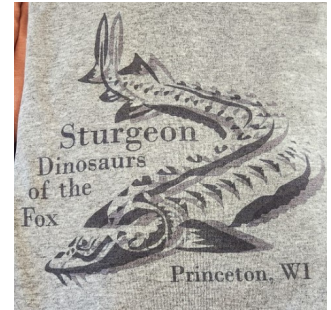

Fall Light Pole Decorating Contest Rules

There is no fee to enter. Only businesses and organizations may enter— no individuals.

All decorations must be up by October 6th and maintained through October 31st.
All decorations must be removed by Monday, November 10th.

Voting and Judging

Anyone may vote for their favorite light poles via Facebook or paper ballot. Pictures of each light pole will be posted on the Princeton Chamber of Commerce Facebook page, and on paper ballots available at the Princeton Public library. On Facebook, each “like” = 1 vote. On the paper ballots, people may check the boxes next to the light poles they like the best. Each person can vote for more than one light pole. Participants in the HalloWINE Sip’N’Shop will be encouraged to vote.

Judging for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place and tabulating votes for the People’s Choice Award will take place on Monday, October 13th. Results will be published soon thereafter.

RULES

Your light pole must have a sign indicating which business or civic group it was decorated by.

Light poles can be claimed on a first-come, first-served basis. Each business or group may decorate ONE light pole anywhere in the city.

Absolutely no permanent alteration of the light pole is permitted.

All decorations must be secured with zip ties, string, twine, thin wire, etc. No tape or anything that will damage the light poles or paint.

Decorations should be weather resistant, and any damage which occurs throughout the month must be fixed.

You can use city electricity for your display if the light pole you choose has power. Please ask the Chamber if you need an extension cord.

Lights and extra electrical cords used in decorating must be designated as “for outdoor use” (otherwise electricity may fail).

No political statements or endorsements of any kind are allowed.

Decorations must be “rated PG.” No gore, sexual content, swear words, drug references, etc.

No unsafe materials may be used (e.g. trip hazards, frayed or broken electrical wires, open flames, real knives or other weapons, etc.).

No live animals may be included in displays.

Decorations should not take up the whole sidewalk (by law we need at least a 36” width to be free and clear).

Decorations should not cover street signage or street lights, shouldn’t take up parking space, and shouldn’t affect the safety of drivers or pedestrians.

Please do promote your business or organization, but emphasis should be on the decorations, not signage.

The City of Princeton reserves the right to remove any decorations which violate these rules.
